OUR PARTNERSHIP

The Australian Government has partnered with Community Refugee Sponsorship Australia (CRSA) in the design and delivery of a new Australian community sponsorship program for refugees, known as the 'CRISP' (Community Refugee Integration and Settlement Pilot).

This program enables groups of everyday Australians (including regional communities) to welcome refugees into their local community from 'day one' of their Australian journey, and provide them with practical resettlement and integration support. This is in line with community sponsorship programs operating successfully around the world.

ANHCA will be providing administrative and financial management support in

the delivery of the CRISP program.

ANHCA is providing access to the Shout for Good platform as a tool that enables Community Supporter Groups (CSGs) to raise funds they anticipate requiring when welcoming and supporting a refugee household, and to provide donors with a tax-deductible receipt.

Beyond this, ANHCA's goal is to utilise our extensive network of Neighbourhood and Community Houses and Centres (NCHC) to establish a link between the CSGs and nearby NCHC's to offer assistance and foster a strong sense of community upon arrival.

We will be reaching out to Houses and Centres local to each CSGs as they welcome their families, inquiring about any assistance they can offer.





FORMING A GROUP TO WELCOME A FAMILY

Everyday Australians are making an invaluable difference in supporting and welcoming refugee families settle into the local community.

The Community Refugee Integration and Settlement Pilot (CRISP) enables a local group of five or more people to welcome and support a refugee family from their first day in Australia. CRSA screens and trains groups prior to matching them with a refugee household that has been identified as in urgent need of resettlement by the UNHCR.

You don't need to have an established group to start taking the first steps. Community members can submit an individual expression of interest to receive an invitation to our info sessions, updates about our programs, and tips for forming a local group.

If you've already formed a group and you're ready to begin the application process, you can submit your group's intention to apply. We recommend designating a 'Group Coordinator' to submit a form on behalf of the group.
